## House Brackmann grading of facial nerve palsies

Grade	Clinical features
I: Normal function	Normal function in all areas
II: Mild dysfunction	Gross: Slight weakness on close inspection. Normal symmetry at rest.
	Motion: Forehead: Moderate to good function
	Eye: closure with minimal effort.
	Mouth: Slight asymmetry
III: Moderate	Gross: Obvious but not disfiguring differences between the two sides.
dysfunction	Normal tone and symmetry at rest
	Motion: Forehead: Slight to moderate movement
	Eyes: complete closure with effort
	Mouth: slight weakness with maximum effort
IV: Moderately	Gross: Obvious weakness and/or disfiguring asymmetry. Normal
severe dysfunction	symmetry and tone at rest.
	Motion: Forehead: No movements
	Eyes: Incomplete eye closure
	Mouth: Asymmetric with maximum effort
V: Severe	Gross: Only barely perceptible motion
dysfunction	Asymmetry at rest
	Motion: Forehead: None
	Eyes: Incomplete closure
	Mouth: Slight movements
VI: Paralysis	No movement of facial muscles

## **Atypical features (consider other diagnosis)**

Reduced power of the limbs → consider stoke / Guillain Barré syndrome

Ear discharge →consider otitis media/ externa or cholesteatoma

Rash especially erythema migrans  $\rightarrow$  Lyme's disease

Hearing loss with no clear cause  $\rightarrow$  CPA tumour

Parotid mass → parotid infection or tumour

Bilateral facial nerve palsy, chronic cough and erythema nodosum → sarcoidosis
